Buffalo State is excited to announce a partnership with the New York State Mentoring Program. The Mentoring Program at Buffalo State will match volunteers with 4th, 5th & 6th grade students at Buffalo Public School 76, Herman Badillo Bilingual Academy.

Our partnership will allow you to mentor a student **one hour per week** on Tuesdays from 2:40 pm to 3:40 pm. You must be willing to commit this time every week throughout the school year.

Mentors will engage with students and their interest through discussion, activities, and games to develop a relationship. Volunteers will be trained by The Mentoring Program and a staff person from the school will supervise the sessions and be available to you throughout the program. Spanish speakers are particularly encouraged to participate.

As State employees, mentoring time will have to be your own either through flexible scheduling or using personal time. If your job responsibilities allow you to make this weekly commitment please discuss your participation with your supervisor.
